Welcome to ETVC

Who we are... and how to find us.

ETVC (Educational TV Channel) is a social, recreational and educational support group for transvestites, transsexuals, transgenderists and their friends and/or Significant Others.

In the spring of 1982, a small group of cross-dressers and transgenderists in the San Francisco Bay area, wanting to create a safe social milieu for themselves, began getting together on a regular basis at various individuals' homes. We chose a name for our group (ETVC) and as word got around and more people started showing up at the gatherings, we established regular monthly socials at a San Francisco restaurant, the Chez Mollet. In less than a year, our "theme" parties were drawing an average of 40-60 people and ETVC had become established as one of the best places in the Bay area for TV's, TS's and TG's to go for a sociable night out.

Starting in 1983, we began to adopt a set of bylaws to provide a formal structure for the group. Under these Bylaws, ETVC is a membership organization (although non-members who share our interests are welcome to attend) wherein responsibility for coordinating its activities rests with a 5-member Executive Committee.

Since we exist to help meet the needs of TV's, TS's and TG's, we are delighted to welcome new people who share our interests to any of our regular meetings which take place the last Thursday of every month at the Chez Mollet restaurant, 527 Bryant St., San Francisco, CA from 8 pm to 12 midnight. Their specialty is French cuisine and reservations are usually advisable. Directions to the Chez Mollet are on the back.

We would like to encourage all our friends, new and old, to become members of ETVC. On the reverse is a mail-in membership form for your convenience. Anyone can also become a member at the door on the night of any ETVC function. Reprinted below is the Statement of Purpose and membership eligibility criteria from our Bylaws.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purpose of the "Educational TV Channel" (hereinafter "ETVC") is two-fold: (1) to serve the educational, social and recreational needs of transvestites (either female or male), transsexuals (either female or male), and all other persons (either female or male) whose social role differs in any degree from that role considered to be appropriate for an individual of his or her genetic sex, and (2) to undertake educational activities intended to assist the general public in comprehending transvestism, transsexualism, and transgenderism.

MEMBERSHIP (Eligibility)

Membership in ETVC is open to any person (male or female) who is 18 years of age or older and who believes that he or she is, or may be, a (1) transvestite, (2) transsexual, or (3) person whose social role differs in any degree from that role considered to be appropriate for an individual of his or her genetic sex. Membership is also open to (1) a spouse or significant other of one who is eligible for membership in ETVC under the preceding sentence, and (2) one who is 18 years of age or older and who has (a) a personal or professional interest in one or more persons who fall into one or more of the categories established in the preceding sentence, or (b) a personal or professional interest in transgenderism or gender dysphoria generally.

(BYLAWS adopted May 31, 1984)

From the East Bay:

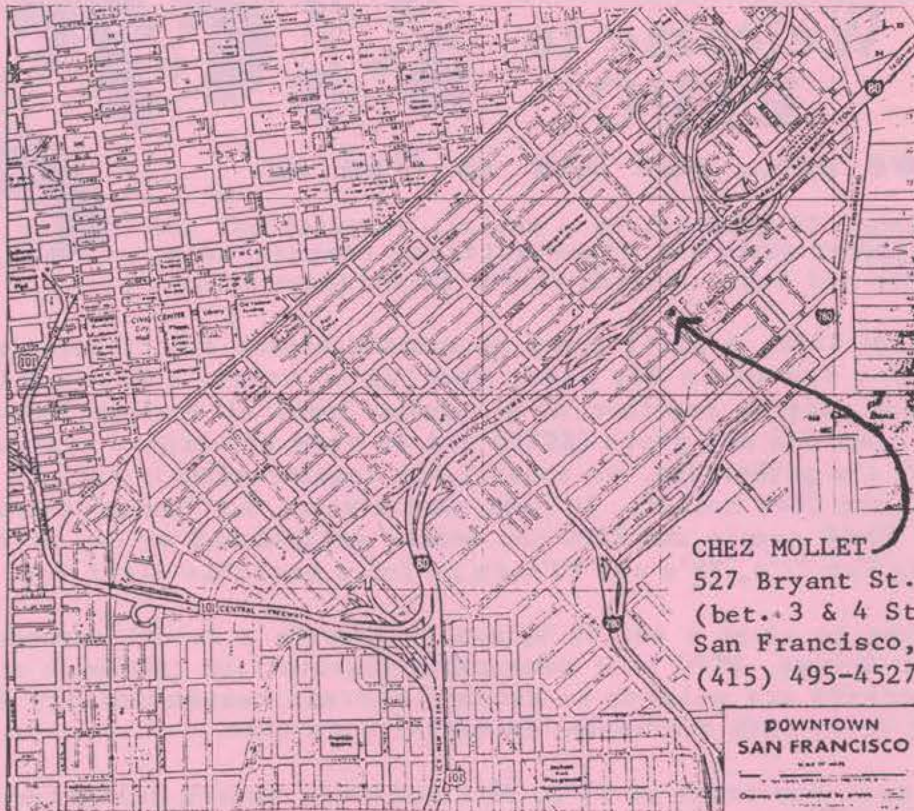
Take I-80 or I-580 to across the Bay Bridge to the Fifth St. exit, turn left onto Fifth St. and left again onto Bryant St.

SHARON'S HINTS AND TIPS

---* alternative to electrolysis?-----

As this is a new column in the ETVC news letter, some preliminaries are in order... First, i'm Sharon. I'LL be with you each issue with ideas for a kind of "do it yourself" approach to crossdressing taken from my own experiences and(hopefully;) those of other ETVC members and friends. Please write to this column with your own ideas and "secrets" for looking good. The address is on the banner of the newsletter. Now on to the subject.

Those of us with a lot of facial hair are stuck with a serious problem if we are to appear attractive as a woman. A super-close shave followed by skillful foundation work can do wonders... for a few hours. Even then, a "made up" look may not be what you really want. Electrolysis? Perhaps if you have \$3,000 and 150 hours of time to spare.

In the 60's some of the early gender clinics used a waxing method on beards which gave good results when accompanied by large Estrogen doses. It works; This forgotten technique certainly deserves to be known to the TV/TS community. Your results may not duplicate mine, but here's how to do it...

Waxing seems to work by diverting the energy a hair needs for growth and using it instead to repair root damage. Repeated waxing reduces the number, size, and darkness of hairs. Many hairs seem to give up entirely. I'M not convinced that hormone use is necessary for good results(though i am on a moderate dose myself). What does pay off is patience, daily attention (at first) and some initial inconvenience.

I used "ZIP" brand hot wax, which is available in most drug stores. This wax is a mixture of pine tar and beeswax. The instructions included are enough to start with, but waxing the face is no easy task. It seems to take about 3/16ths inch of growth for the wax to get a good grip the first application. Some of your friends may wonder if you are growing a beard-just the opposite;

I heated the wax in an old ceramic coffee mug sitting in a pot of gently boiling water and applied the wax with a tongue depressor or small spoon. The wax must be as hot as possible without being painful. Try a spot on your legs first to get familiar with the procedure.(Better still, do your entire body;) then apply a thick strip about 1/2 in. wide and 3 in. long vertically on one cheek. Leave

a thick knob of wax near the chin (this is your grip to pull with). When the wax has cooled enough to be solid but still flexible, pull the strip off with a firm, quick, and smooth motion parallel to the plane of the face. direction of hair growth is important always pull in the opposite direction.

There is some pain involved-about like being slapped in the face. You may find that the areas above the lip and on the neck are just too sensitive to do this way at first. Later waxings become almost painless and large areas can be done in one application.

It may take several evenings to completely clear your face the first time. Use tweezers for sensitive areas and missed hairs. During my first week, I had to get out the tweezers every night to get the hairs which broke at the skin line instead of pulling free. The still-enlarged follicle openings tended to get clogged with dirt or tiny specks of clotted blood, so I scrubbed my face nightly with rubbing alcohol. In about two weeks, the second growth began. The recently-pulled hairs were thinner, less dark, and weakly rooted. After a few days growth, they easily yielded to the wax. Areas of the face formerly too sensitive to wax were now no problem as the hairs lifted free easily. Today, my face is almost as clear as if I'd had electrolysis - not a trace of shadow. I use tweezers every other night on any dark hairs which persist, but the majority of the growth is thin and very light colored. Thirty minutes waxing on a weekend is all that is needed to keep my face clean, clear, and soft. (The initial waxing took me about 8 hours in four nights and it was not fun.)

Some cautions here-waxing changes the hair roots such that electrolysis is not effective for up to several months after the last waxing. Don't use wax if your skin is very thin or sensitive. Never wax the same area twice in a day- if you do, you may find yourself peeling later as if you'd been sunburned. After waxing, clean your face with baby oil followed by alcohol. It's a good idea to wax in the evening and then sleep with a light layer of an antibacterial ointment such as Neosporin or Bacitracin to reduce the possibility of infection. Never use cream bleach or other harsh chemicals on your face after waxing. BE careful where you do this-hot wax ruins clothing and rugs. Allow for at least a month a month of waxing and tweezing before expecting acceptable results and don't give up; Toss out that heavy foundation, ladies;

TV/TS Vacations

If you're ready for your vacation but have no plans as yet, you might consider the 11th Annual Fantasia Fair, sponsored by The Outreach Institute in Boston, MA, which will be held in the unique and friendly setting of Provincetown, MA, at the tip of beautiful Cape Cod, from October 18th thru the 27th. The program includes several major events: a Fashion Show, the Fantasia Fair Follies, the Town & Gown Supper, the Fantasy Ball and the Awards Banquet; a number of fun affairs such as Kite Fly and Whale Watch; and a comprehensive offering of workshops and seminars such as a Fashion & Beauty Course, Speech Improvement Program, Personal Growth Workshop, Spouses' Workshop, Legal Seminar, Medical/Health Issues Seminar, Sociological Development Seminar and an Outreach Institute Seminar.

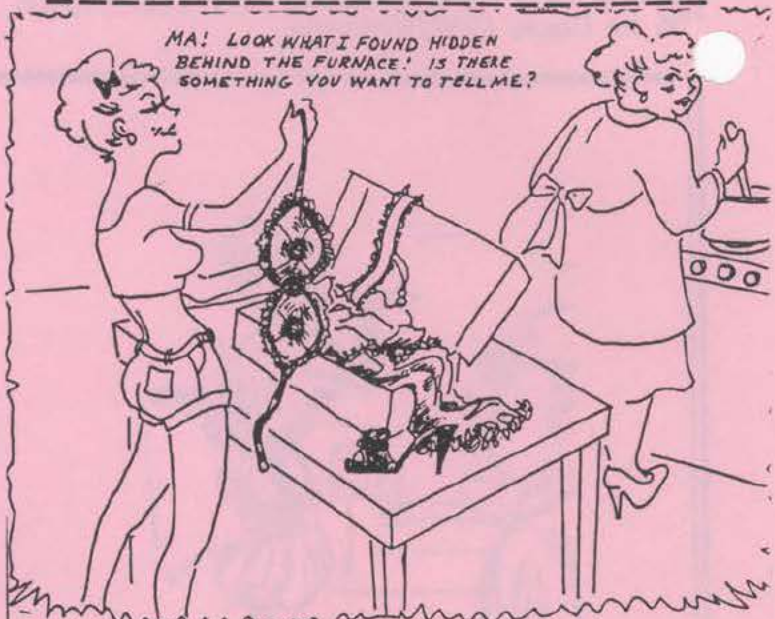
