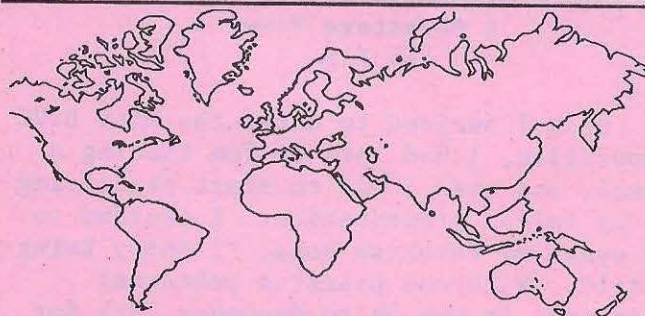

NEWS FROM AROUND THE WORLD



Chicago's Chi Chapter members recently appeared with their spouses on the nationally syndicated Sally Jesse Raphael Show. The program was to have been a TV fashion show but, the producers decided to focus on the TV/Significant Other relationships, a much deeper subject.

The Tiffany Club in Massachusetts has been working overtime. Besides organizing the IFGE convention this March, they have also produced another issue of the TV-TS Tapestry magazine, this time with a full color cover and over 130 pages. In their spare time they have had to deal with real estate problems involved in selling their house and looking for a new center for their club.

The TV/TS support group in England has also moved into a new facility and with the work and money of their supporting members have the site open and running for their weekly weekend meetings.

In Portland the Emerald City club has won a suit against a motel which evicted them. The motel must pay a fine and provide equal housing opportunity regardless of sexual orientation. We do have rights and must assert them, through legal action if necessary.

ETVC

Regularly scheduled socials, special interest groups, and committee activities serve the needs of members and provide opportunities for member activities in ETVC. A five-person Executive Board sets the major direction for ETVC. The Education & Outreach Committee develops and delivers public and internal programs to promote gender choice. The Social Committee develops social themes and handles event logistics. Our programs depend on member participation to create and administer them. We solicit your ideas and active assistance in making all this possible.

A monthly social meeting is held on the last Thursday of each month at the Chez Mollet Restaurant, 527 Bryant Street (between 3rd and 4th), San Francisco. While there is usually a "theme," participation is optional, as there is no particular dress code. No-host cocktails and dining facilities are available. Dinners are served until 10 PM. All-inclusive gender support groups meet on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays, and last Friday of the month at 8:00 PM. The Center is located at 2712 Telegraph Avenue, Berkeley.
