Lauren accused him of doing the naughty with another woman.


Horst broke down and admitted he was a stripper.

"And sometimes that's not all they want," claims Bund. "I had to learn karate since some of the tougher customers started pestering me for dates.


"Now when anyone starts something, he finds out that Miss Grunik is as deadly as she is beautiful."
