ETVC Member Noted in "Omni" Magazine

When computer scientist David Hall arrives at Stanford Research Institute to do consulting work, his colleagues there are no longer shocked to see him wearing a skirt. Several years ago while attending a yoga conference in India, Hall tried on a skirtlike wrap called a "lungi." He's been hooked ever since.

Hall now finds wearing trousers to be illogical, restrictive, and unintelligent. It is his goal to persuade more men to switch to skirts, especially since women now have society's sanction to wear pants.

A Book Review by Suzanne

BOYS WILL BE GIRLS: THE HIDDEN WORLD OF THE HETEROSEXUAL MALE TRANSVESTITE

by John Talamini

This slim volume, which appears to be an expanded college term paper, is divided into five short chapters: 1) the historical and cultural aspects of cross-dressing; 2) the concept of the second self; 3) tranvestites and marriage; 4) the transvestite subculture; and 5) androgyny and transvestism.

Unfortunately, Talamini's survey of these themes is cursory and superficial. Nonetheless, the book is not without its virtues. His description of the purposes of transvestite organizations seems accurate. And his application of the "minority" concept to TV's is of interest. On this point Talamini suggests that while psychiatry continues to define transvestism as social deviance, TV's are redefining themselves as a minority group which is oppressed by a male dominant society.

Is the book worth reading? If you are willing to accept a shallow and superficial treatment of the topic, and your tolerance for typographical errors and word misuages is high, you might find some value in this small volume. The book is NOT "must" reading, as its shortcomings and flaws outweigh its few desirable attributes.

Who's Driving Whom

Ever notice that when a man and woman are riding in a car, that the man is usually driving? One Sunday, as my wife and I drove (with me driving!!!) from San Jose to San Francisco on Highway 280, we took a survey.

In a sample of 57, we found that in 85% of the cases where a man and woman were riding together, the man was driving.


When a woman was driving, the car was of a foreign brand 80% of the time, compared to 53% when a man was driving.

Regardless of who was driving whom, both sexes chose the fast lane about 40% of the time, the middle lane about half the time, and the slow lane only about 10% of the time.

We were unable to validate that the gender appearance was, in fact, correlated to the actual sex of the persons in the vehicles.


